Description: The conduct of science involves both sound research and responsible research. One important aspect of the responsible conduct of research involves meeting all regulatory requirements of the research. In the case of research with animals, this means the Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee; in the case of research with human subjects, this means the Institutional Review Board. This session aims to discuss how researchers can address the requirements of research with animals and human subjects, including but not limited to: what the IACUC/IRB requires, what is necessary for IACUC/IRB approval, what to think about when preparing an IACUC/IRB submission or animal/human subject section of a grant application.

### **Writing a Teaching Philosophy**

*Primary Audience: Graduate Students and Postdocs*

*Presenters: James Gregory, PhD and Richard Turner, PhD, IUPUI Center for Teaching and Learning*

Description: A teaching philosophy is a self-reflective expression of a faculty member's beliefs and experiences that have shaped his or her values and teaching and learning strategies. By contrast, a teaching statement makes the case that the writer has achieved excellence in his or her teaching. The statement explains how the writer's teaching philosophy has been put into practice, providing specific evidence to demonstrate successful student learning. Both of these documents are often used as part of a job application, a promotion and tenure dossier, a teaching award nomination, and even course syllabi. In this two-hour workshop, participants will explore and begin to answer the fundamental questions that inform both a teaching philosophy and a teaching statement. Participants will begin to identify discipline-appropriate benchmarks for excellence in teaching as well as evidence that they have met these benchmarks in their own teaching. Participants will leave with a body of text that they can then develop into a full teaching philosophy or statement.

**Writing a Teaching Philosophy**

Description: A teaching philosophy is a self-reflective expression of a faculty member's beliefs and experiences that have shaped his or her values and teaching and learning strategies. By contrast, a teaching statement makes the case that the writer has achieved excellence in his or her teaching. The statement explains how the writer's teaching philosophy has been put into practice, providing specific evidence to demonstrate successful student learning. Both of these documents are often used as part of a job application, a promotion and tenure dossier, a teaching award nomination, and even course syllabi. In this two-hour workshop, participants will explore and begin to answer the fundamental questions that inform both a teaching philosophy and a teaching statement. Participants will begin to identify discipline-appropriate benchmarks for excellence in teaching as well as evidence that they have met these benchmarks in their own teaching. Participants will leave with a body of text that they can then develop into a full teaching philosophy or statement.
